Graduates of the Musical Theatre Program are currently performing on Broadway in *Hamilton* and *Carousel* – Off-Broadway in *Sweeney Todd*.



Dr. Luvada A. Harrison is an Assistant Professor of at the University of Alabama in the Department of Theatre and Dance where she teaches voice. She enjoys a varied and distinguished academic and performing career. Harrison has performed with regional opera companies and symphony orchestras throughout the United States and Europe. She received national exposure as Aida in the “Drama Queens” episode on HBO’s hit series *Sex and the City*. As an Arts Educator, Harrison has worked with the Education Departments of the New York City Opera, the Metropolitan Opera Guild and the “Meet the Artist” Series at Lincoln Center. Since her arrival in Tuscaloosa, she has been a featured soloist with the Tuscaloosa Symphony and the Prentice Chorale. As a recitalist, Harrison has presented recitals and masterclasses at a number of colleges and universities along the east coast. As an adjudicator, she has served on audition panels for the Alabama Federated Music Club,

Alabama Vocal Arts and the Negro Spiritual Foundation. Active in community arts, she has served on the Board of Directors for the Tuscaloosa Symphony, Theatre Tuscaloosa and currently serves on the Board of Directors for The Arts & Humanities Council of Tuscaloosa. Dr. Harrison is a member of the National Association of Teachers of Singing, the National Opera Association, the Southeastern Theatre Conference, the Musical Educator’s Alliance, and Pi Kappa Lambda.
